Foundation Training Programme

We currently offer 11 foundation training placements (8 x 12-month hospital placements ; 2 x 6-month hospital plus 6-month Primary Care Network placements and 1 split post with Cambridgeshire and Peterborough NHS Foundation Trust (6 months at each site). Trainees are supervised and supported by experienced clinical pharmacists throughout their rotations.

As a trainee pharmacist, you will work alongside experienced pharmacists during your clinical rotations in surgery, medicine, neurology, paediatrics and admissions unit. Trainees also shadow senior pharmacists in specialist clinical areas such as transplant and critical care.

Rotations

You will also undertake off-site rotations in community pharmacy and one of CCG, cardiothoracic or mental health specialist centres. Longer rotations (8 weeks and 13 weeks) are included within the training year to allow for learning in depth and a smooth transition to life as a qualified pharmacist.

Learning support

Each trainee will have a designated supervisor, a clinical support supervisor and a buddy allocated. They will also be supported by the Pharmacy Education and Training team.
